


How to implement by leveraging:

- Leverage points & Emergent properties (champions)
- Sectoral strategies or plans (Financing and budgeting)
- Aligning result chains and gender equality performance management
- Strengthen national capacities critical to identifying and implementing gendered cross-sectoral impacts!
- Promote the benefits of incorporating gender in forestry & Nat Resource Mngt
- Regular reviews and reporting
- Feedback Loops (gender analyses, Policy briefs), M&E systems and data
