OVERVIEW

- Climate change disproportionately impacts the poorest and most vulnerable of our population
- Globally, 1.2 billion people are estimated to live extreme poverty
- 900 million of whom live in rural areas, and 750 million work in agriculture, usually as smallholder family farmers
- We have seen **Disaster risks have risen** over recent decades, and **more extreme weather conditions** in future are likely to increase the number and scale of disasters.

OVERVIEW (Cont'd)

- Existing methods and tools of disaster risk reduction, and climate risk management has provided capacities for substantially reducing risks and adapting to climate change.
- There is concern that the demands and costs for response actions are increasing beyond their capacities to effectively assist by humanitarian actors
- Natural hazards and climate-related disasters disregard political borders, where additional barriers can complicate mitigation, response and recovery efforts



GENDER

- Refers to the Economic, social and cultural attributes and opportunities with being a Male or Female
- These are socially constructed differences between men and women in types of activities carried out and in roles and responsibilities
- Differences in themselves should not be problematic between Women and Men, with women at disadvantage
- Differences have translated into unequal access to and control over resources and decision-making power

ACCESS AND CONTROL



ACCESS AND CONTROL

- Access to refer as <u>right & opportunity</u>...... Is the ability to use a resource but not necessarily to have control over it
- Control over refers to <u>right and power over the productive</u> <u>resources</u>: Is the ability to make ultimate decisions about the use of resources. Making independent decisions over it and even sell/dispose of it where applicable.

ACCESS AND CONTROL (Cont'd)

- E.g., Access to social protection: Women and men experience and cope with risk, insecurity and crisis differently.
- ...unequal property rights, interruptions to their working lives and unequal sharing of **unpaid care responsibilities**.....

DEFINING RESOURCES

Productive and Economic



economic (Land, Equipment, Tools, Cash, Employment.....)

Political



Representative organizations,
Leadership, Education and information,
Experiences in the public sphere, Self confidence and credibility

Time



Scarce but very critical for women E.g. in Food crisis & VAW time is of core, Decision Making, Response, Addressing immediate needs



GRIEVANCE REDRESS MECHANISMS

- Land and natural resources related disputes which may manifest themselves not only in relation to land use for crop farming but also for forestry, fisheries as well as cattle grazing/tracks
- Grievance redress mechanisms (GRMs) should be accessible, affordable, independence, impartial, and transparent
- Complaint processes should be clear, simple and flexible and the mechanism/s should be physically and economically accessible

GRIEVANCE REDRESS MECHANISMS (Cont'd)

- Mass awareness-raising and sensitization across the most popular media platforms in widely used local languages on dispute/conflict prevention and resolution mechanisms
- Development of a National Policy on Land ...as a guiding instrument for all stakeholders involved in land administration
- Legal assistance should be available to the parties and its availability should be widely publicized
- Community-based paralegals can play an important role in sensitization as well as the provision of legal aid.

- To ensure women's economic empowerment and access to and control over resources requires an integrated approach to growth and development
- Focused on **gender-responsive** Public services
- Full coverage of social protection measures
- Deep rooted Grievance Redress Mechanisms (GRM)
- Access to resources to promote and protect disaster and climate Risk.....information, education, technology and services

- To promote effective Land and Natural Resources (LNR) governance
- Facilitate the implementation of VGGT- Voluntary
 Guidelines on the Responsible Governance of Tenure of
