





# CLIMATE FINANCE ISSUES FOR CARIBBEAN SIDS: KEY INDICATORS AND DATA

INDICATOR	VALUE
Share of global climate finance flowing to SIDS (2021–2022)	0.2%
Average annual international public adaptation finance received by 39 SIDS	USD 2 billion
Estimated annual adaptation finance SIDS collectively need (NAPs & NDCs)	USD 12 billion
USD 12 billion need as a share of total global climate finance	1.2%
Share of adaptation finance delivered as debt	44% (increasing macroeconomic risk)
Share of total climate finance SIDS receive relative to global flows	<0.5% (UN SDG Financing, 2024)
Adaptation finance concentrated in just 10 SIDS	67%
Annual financing gap faced by women-owned SMEs in emerging markets	USD 1.4–1.7 trillion (IFC, SME Finance Forum)
